3. Research information and activities

3.1. Fields of research; past and current research collaborations and joint initiatives

Ideophones in English, Finnish and Swedish. Research topics include the relation between form and meaning; the possible multicategoriality of ideophones and their overlap with other "ragbag" categories in grammar (esp. adverbs and interjections); the translation of ideophones across languages; and the multimodal nature of ideophones (esp. their uses in comics and cartoons).

The work is done in collaboration with FD Maria Wiktorsson from Malmö University. Some aspects have involved Eleni Seitanidi, a doctoral student at Lund University, as well as BA students at Lund University who have written their BA theses on topics within this field.

Theoretical linguistics, with particular reference to Finnish and other Finnic languages; and English. Past and current research topics include adverbials; prepositional and postpositional phrases; relative clauses; and argument structure and realization (esp. various passive and impersonal constructions).

This has long been my "main" research field. Large parts of the work are done by myself, but this field also involves collaboration with FD Fredrik Heinat and FD Eva Klingvall (esp. between 2008 and 2012). Other collaborations have involved Dr. Diane Nelson (University of Leeds), Katrin Hiletam (University of Manchester) and Elsi Kaiser (University of Pennsylvania).

Pedagogical research on teaching academic writing to second language writers of English; the use of MOOCs in teaching and learning; the use of digital teaching and learning tools (esp. in the teaching of academic writing); and the value of teaching study planning to undergraduate students. Research into university pedagogics was initiated in the early 2010s as a by-product of a course development project in academic writing, with FD Cecilia Wadsö Lecaros. The work has expanded and regularly involves initiatives between myself, FD Lene Nordrum, FD Ellen Turner and FD Cecilia Wadsö Lecaros. Some aspects of this research work also involve collaboration with several colleagues at the English Department at Bethlehem University.
