PROVDEL 1



Det finns bara ett korrekt alternativ till varje mening, och ett svarsalternativ från listan kan bara användas högst en gång. Det korrekta svarsalternativet är alltid ett ord/ordpar eller en fras vars betydelse passar i sammanhanget. Notera att det är ordformen under själva meningen, på den streckade linjen, som ska översättas.

Notera också att svarsalternativen på varje rad i de tre kolumnerna ibland består av två ord. Det är då tänkt att båda orden skall ges som svar. Se exempel nedan.

PROVDEL 2

INSTRUKTION:

Denna provdel innehåller 30 (1-30) frågor. Varje fråga består av en meningskontext med en lucka där du skall fylla i ett ord. Ordet skall passa i sammanhanget och vara rätt stavat. Första bokstaven i ordet är alltid given som en ledtråd, och ibland är flera bokstäver givna.

Provdelen testar kunskap om kollokationer och idiom, d.v.s. kunskapen om kombinationer av ord som frekvent förekommer tillsammans som lexikala fraser i det engelska språket. Detta innebär att ett avgett svar inte alltid ger poäng även om ordet är ett rättstavat engelskt ord, då det är kunskapen om specifika och vedertagna fraser som testas.

INSTRUCTION:

This test part consists of 30 (1-30) items. Each item consists of a gapped sentence. Your task is to fill in the word missing. The word must fit the context and be correctly spelled. The first letter of the targeted word is always given as a prompt and sometimes several letters are given.

The test part targets collocation and idiom knowledge, i.e. the knowledge of frequently recurring word combinations – lexical phrases – in the English language. This means that an answer may not be awarded points despite being a correctly spelled English word, since it is the knowledge of specific and conventionalized phrases that is targeted.
