THE BIRGIT RAUSING LANGUAGE PROGRAMME

Instructions to applicants for grants for the organisation of conferences or workshops in Linguistics or the Language Sciences

About the support for conferences

Lund University has instituted the Birgit Rausing Language Programme. The programme can award grants for the organisation of a scholarly conference or workshop within Linguistics or the Language Sciences focusing on research on language, communication and cognition, preferably with a linguistic focus. The determining criterion in the assessment of applications is the expected scholarly yield of the conference/workshop.

Conditions

The conference or workshop is to be international and organised in Lund with the participation of researchers from Lund University and cover the research field of Linguistics. The event is to maintain high quality and the invited speakers are to be internationally recognised researchers. The organiser is responsible for the publication of the conference proceedings. A scholarly and financial report is to be submitted to the management group of the Birgit Rausing Language Programme at the latest three months after the conference has taken place.

Who can apply

Applicants must be a PhD and active at Lund University at the time of application.

How to apply

The application is to be submitted as an original or by email, in which case all documents are to be attached as scanned copies. The application is to include:

- The theme of the conference/workshop in Linguistics and its aim.
- Information on the title, preliminary programme, and venue for the conference/workshop, as well as a list of planned Swedish and international participants.
- Expected number of participants (if possible the proportion of research students, junior and senior researchers should also be indicated)
- A list of named invited speakers and the costs involved in inviting them.
- Total budget for the conference or workshop, including a calculation of income and costs as well as preliminary information on how the costs are to be distributed among the various sources of funding.
