<b>4.</b>	<b>Course Content</b>	
1.	Brief description of the course and its content including details of any sub-divisions	<i>The course deals with the elements of basic Arabic grammar not previously covered and the student is given the opportunity to review and practice the grammatical elements covered in ARA B01. The course includes the reading of moderately difficult non-fiction texts. The course also actively trains the student's ability to read, understand and translate texts from Arabic. The use of Arabic dictionaries is practiced.</i>
