1.	Brief description of the course and its content including details of any	<i>The course completes the study of fundamental Arabic grammar and provides the student with an opportunity for revision, practice and in-depth study of the grammatical</i>

	sub-divisions	<p><i>aspects treated in ARAB03. The course includes reading of moderately difficult texts of different types. Furthermore, active practice in the ability to read, comprehend and translate texts in Arabic is provided. Students also get practice in using an Arabic dictionary.</i></p> <p><i>The course comprises exercises in everyday communication with a gradually increased vocabulary (approximately 1500 words). The ability to understand and use Arabic in different contexts as well as to read and write simple texts of different types is actively trained. Equal emphasis is placed on oral and written proficiency and reading and listening comprehension as on translation to and from Arabic. Furthermore, the course focuses on the ability to communicate in simple and useful situations.</i></p> <p><i>The course includes the following modules:</i></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <i>1. Modern Standard Arabic, Introduction II, 7.5 credits</i> <i>2. Communicative Arabic II, 7.5 credits</i>
