1.	Brief description of the course and its content including details of any sub-divisions	<i>The course includes practice in oral and written proficiency, and listening comprehension. A greater number of kanji characters are learnt and reading comprehension is practised by studying simple fiction and non-fictional prose. The course also provides an introduction to academic writing with a focus on Japanese linguistics. The emphasis is on active student</i>
