Brief description of the course and its content including details of any sub-divisions	<i>The course provides basic knowledge and understanding of Old Icelandic, which is obtained through the methodical study of classic Icelandic texts, the majority of which are taken from the 13th century. In addition, knowledge of phonetics, inflection and syntax are studied in greater depth from both a synchronic and diachronic perspective.</i>

1.	Teaching methods employed including details of any compulsory components	<i>Teaching consists of exercises, lectures, and seminars. All elements involving proficiency are obligatory.</i>
