1.	Brief description of the course and its content including details of any sub-divisions	<i>The course studies Greek literature which is read in both its original language and in translation. In addition, the literary history, culture and history of modern Greece are studied in more depth than on previous courses. The course enables continued practice in oral and written language proficiency.</i>
